I am confident the gator was trying to emphasize the fact the Barbers Hill truly is a unique place, and events that transpired this year emphasize that point. Barbers Hill students continue to excel at the highest level. District championships were the norm and for the 20th year in a row, Barbers Hill won the UIL Academic District Championship.

Our students at many grade levels represented Barbers Hill inside and outside the state of Texas. Regardless of the competitive outcome, one thing continues to remain, our students represent their school and families in an exemplary and classy way that causes others to often say... "I'm so impressed with your kids!" It's rewarding to hear our children bragged on, and in fact, other bragging is in order. Our High School was recently named one of the top in the Houston area and received an A+ in the Children at Risk study. We have six students - the most we have ever had - receiving potential National Merit Scholar recognition, which is the highest academic standard in the nation. We have the highest percentage of National Board Certified Teachers in the state. Barbers Hill has the second-largest Education Foundation in the state, and one of the largest in the nation in assets per pupil. Our Board of Trustees has granted raises 11 years in a row, not raised taxes, and increased our fund balance. Perhaps they should be managing the state's finances!

National Merit Scholars

The National Merit Scholarship Program is the gold standard in the United States for measuring and recognizing student academic excellence. Every year, nearly 1.5 million high school students take the Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test. Of these students, less than 5% are selected for recognition. BHHS seniors Rachel Carpenter and Paden Van were named 2015 National Merit Commended Students for their outstanding scores on the PSAT. Rachel will continue her education at the University of Texas at Arlington, and Paden will pursue his degree at Texas A&M University.



Academic Decathlon National Winner

Senior Jeremy Nicolai competed in Academic Decathlon at the Regional and State levels, and won 4th place overall at State for the second consecutive year. Jeremy was the State Champ in Language/Literature, Art, and Social Science, and was invited to participate in the National Online Ac Dec competition. At the National level, Jeremy won 1st place in Language/Literature, 1st place in Social Studies, 2nd place in Science and 3rd place in Art. Jeremy will attend the University of Texas at Austin in the fall with a full tuition scholarship.

BPA National Participant

BHHS Junior Haleigh Thibodeaux competed in the Business Professionals of America's regional competition, placing first in Human Resources Management. She advanced to State competition, where she placed 3rd, and to National competition in Boston this spring, where she placed 22nd in the United States.

Barbers Hill High School Academic UIL students brought home the 20th consecutive Sweepstakes Award during the District 21-5A meet this spring, along with 18 First Place medals. The Sweepstakes trophy is awarded each year to the school with the highest total points of all schools participating in the meet. Barbers Hill earned a total score of 509 points across 14 categories, more than 175 points above the second place school, Crosby. Other competitors included Kingwood Park, C. E. National Board Certified Teachers

Three BHISD teachers this year achieved the highest credential possible for classroom teachers, the National Board Certification. Teachers Lisa LeDoux, Kellie Rogers, and Tiffany Woodward succeeded in the rigorous application and submission process, which takes approximately 2 years to complete. Barbers Hill now has 29 nationally certified teachers, one of the highest percentages of NBCTs in Texas.

Baxter

The Big-Hearted Dog



A crooked tail, an FFA program, and two women with a vision changed the world for a Great Dane puppy named Baxter.

Baxter was unwanted as a breeder puppy because of a crooked tail. When his owners opted to sell, it was the right moment for Barbers Hill Ag teacher Mary Wilson, who had wanted to begin a Therapy Dog program at Barbers Hill High School for several years.

Makenna Castaneda, an incoming senior at BHHS and president of their FFA Chapter, had considered a therapy dog project for her Supervised Agricultural Experience (SAE), but she didn't have a dog that would fit the needs of the program.

Wilson purchased Baxter, and introduced him to Makenna.

"From the minute Makenna and Baxter met, there was an immediate bond," said Wilson. She was so sure the two would make a great team, she stayed at the school woodshop till midnight that night, building a new house for Baxter.

Makenna and Wilson completed the training course for therapy dog owners, and Makenna worked with him daily preparing him for his own tests. She trained him to respond to commands, and to be a mannerly puppy.

"Taking a one-year-old Great Dane who's had little to no human interaction and getting him trained is a really big deal," said Makenna. "But his temperament is perfect. He'll let you do anything!"

A few months after starting training, Baxter passed his certification test through the Pet Partners program, and the Eagle Paws program was born.

Many days this year, Baxter attended school with Makenna, resting in his own toddler bed inside a large kennel in the Ag building when he wasn't on call. Two to three days per week, he and Makenna visited other campuses that needed his special touch.

One day, Wilson received a call from one of the elementary campuses. A new student was very upset and didn't want to go into his new classroom. The counselor called for Baxter. The student and Baxter made quick friends, and soon after, the student was introducing him to his new classmates.

"Baxter helps people feel better when they're with him," said Makenna. "He helps people who are struggling with depression or anxiety to live more normal lives."

Baxter also makes regular visits to special education classrooms and to the library. He's a very good listener while shy or struggling students read stories aloud to him, and he lays contentedly on the floor while students play with him.

Our big Great Dane puppy and his mission have won the hearts of the Mont Belvieu community as well. Local veterinary clinic Abshier-Meuth Animal Hospital sponsors all Baxter's medical treatments, and the West Chambers Pilot Club donated his food for an entire year.

Interestingly, Baxter's veterinarian believes the Great Dane's tail is not genetically crooked at all, but rather a birth injury. But without it, Baxter would never have found Barbers Hill, or his therapy dog calling.

"It's been so much fun starting from scratch and making something great through this program," said Makenna. "Baxter is my best friend. It's really amazing to see the difference he's made in so many lives."

BHISD recognized by NAMM Foundation

Barbers Hill ISD was recognized this spring by the National Association of Music Merchants (NAMM) Foundation as among the Best Communities for Music Education, out of the nation's 13,515 school districts. Barbers Hill ISD was one of 41 districts selected in Texas for this honor.



Soaring Eagle Marching Band ranks in Top 10% in Texas

For the second consecutive full competitive season, Barbers Hill Soaring Eagle Marching Band advanced to the State marching competition in San Antonio in November. The BH Band included 263 students this year, of which 110 were freshmen. They performed the show, "Arabian Nights: The Music of Scheherazade," and competed with 31 other top bands from Conference 5A schools across the state. This competition was the 15th appearance at State competition for Director Stone, and the second appearance at State with Barbers Hill students since he began directing in the district in 2010. Barbers Hill Band is under the direction of Kevin Stone, Director of Bands, Sebastian Lopez, Assistant Band Director, and David Johnson, Associate Band Director.



All-State Band Musician

Rob Claassen, senior and officer of the Barbers Hill High School Soaring Eagle Band, was selected for the Texas All-State Band in San Antonio this spring. He is the first band student from Barbers Hill ISD since 1967 to earn this honor in the larger-school category. All-State is the highest honor a Texas music student can receive, with only the top 3% of 64,000 students who auditioned this year reaching this goal. Rob plays the bass clarinet and is a student of Jaime Yim-Talbert, under the leadership of Head Band Director Kevin Stone.



Choir students compete at State

BHHS Choir students earned 69 first place medals at Regional UIL Solo and Ensemble contest this spring, with 28 soloists and 14 ensemble members advancing to state competition in Austin. At State, choir students earned more than 30 medals for First and Second Division ratings. The BHHS Choir is under the direction of Sandy Pentecost, with assistant director Susannah Moorman.

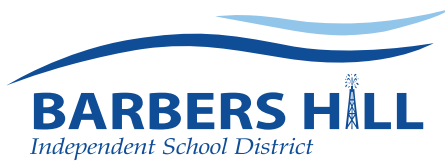
