I am very aware that each day brings the news that another school district is modifying, altering or weakening their re-opening plan. It seems apparent to me that many decisions are being made for

political reasons and that the MOST important aspect is being overlooked by many educational leaders. Kids should ALWAYS come first. BHISD is a child-centered district, and the one non-negotiable in our "Return to Excellence" re-opening is we will make no decision that lessens the best educational experience possible for our children.

Area Superintendents and the Harris County Judge are using safety as a rationale for delaying and/or only offering distance learning. This is in spite of the fact that the most recent guidelines by the CDC (Centers for Disease Control) emphasizes the need for in-person learning and the minimal risk the virus poses for children. The CDC report also spells out the many negative consequences including the safety of children NOT participating in traditional learning. The more viable safety concern regards adults and specifically adults who are identified as most vulnerable. BHISD Board of Trustees have ALWAYS prioritized the needs of our staff whether it be the highest teacher salaries in the state or the millions spent annually to enhance building safety. We know that we have many staff who are concerned about their own health and the health of those they love, and our overriding goal will be to prioritize the safety needs of our entire staff. We have spared no expense to provide the best safety protocol!

Welcome Back To School!

In-Person and Remote Learners

Barbers Hill ISD is committed to meeting the needs of our students, staff, and community as we welcome students both in person and online this fall. As we have planned this unique school year, our guiding principle has been to have a balanced, prescriptive approach to safely meet the needs of both staff and students, as well as the expectations of our community.

Safety measures Barbers Hill ISD will implement this fall:

- 1 Face masks for all staff
- [2] Face shields for teachers
- 3 Hand sanitizer for classrooms and buses, as well as sanitation stations throughout campuses
- 4 One-to-one Plexiglas sneeze guards for desks district wide
- **5** Extra face masks for students who need replacements
- 6 Physical distancing reminder signage
- 7 New ID badges for every student that permit touch-free scans at lunch and libraries
- 8 Modified classroom arrangements to provide physical distancing
- 9 HVAC antiviral/antibacterial air purification systems for band halls, choir rooms, athletic areas, and special services
- 10 Additional playground awnings at elementary levels to permit more outdoor classroom activities
- 11 High touch points disinfected multiple times daily
- 12 Classrooms cleaned daily with hospital-grade disinfectant approved to kill COVID-19
- Electrostatic sprayer backpacks and/or foggers with disinfectant used by custodial staff regularly throughout campuses
- 114 UV Lighting that destroys viruses and bacteria in athletic areas

Joey Presnall Distinguished Alumnus

Joey Presnall has deep roots in Barbers Hill. One of his earliest memories is of riding a tractor with his dad, Joe F. Presnall, and being "turned loose" to drive it. He was six years old.

"Dad loved farming like everyone else enjoys hunting or fishing," Presnall laughed. "When I got out of college, I started farming too, and I continued for the next 28 years."

Presnall's family farmed rice on more than 50 acres in the tiny township of Cove for decades, but growth in the area led to a change in focus after 2004. At that time, Presnall began using his well-honed tractor skills to help shape new housing developments in the community.

The elder Joe F. and his wife Nina (Welch) raised their three children, Carolyn, Sandy, and Joey, in the Barbers

Hill district, while Joe F. served on the BHISD School Board for 17 years. Presnall later continued the family tradition and served from 2003 to 2010, while his son, Joshua, attended BH. Josh now works as a teacher and coach in the district. Presnall's wife Lori also served as a nurse in Barbers Hill from 1999 to 2009.

"I am honored to have grown up in the Barbers Hill school district," said Presnall, a BH Class of 1971 graduate. "All my family has gone to Barbers Hill, and we have fond memories here. We

loved the Mayberry atmosphere of those early years," he said.

The former school board member is also a graduate of Sam Houston State University, where he earned a Bachelor's degree in Industrial Technology before returning to continue his family's farming tradition.

"Barbers Hill has always, since long before I was born, tried to be the best they could be," reflected Presnall. "That continues today, and it shows in the development of our community. Everybody wants the education for their children that Barbers Hill can provide."

Barbers Hill ISD welcomes its 8th campus this fall with the opening of the Barbers Hill Pre-K Center. The campus will be led by Principal Lisa Watkins and will house both Tuition-based and Regular Pre-K classes. The campus was built in 1980 as an Intermediate campus, and later became an Elementary school. It most recently served as Barbers Hill Primary School from 2007 to 2019. This summer the campus underwent more than \$2 million in renovations in preparation for our new Eagle Class of 2034.
