Dr. Greg Poole, Superintendent

I was recently wounded by a marshmallow. The bemused 10-year-old that caused my whelp explained with pride how he'd formed a marshmallow-launching contraption with the remnants of a water bottle and a balloon. It caused me to think of marshmallows in a different way. Many of you and those in our nation and state are thinking of schools in a different way.

Hopefully Barbers Hill ISD conjures up images of excellence, and our students' and staff's work this year have only enhanced that reputation, as this newsletter will attest.

However, continual and recently close-to-home instances of school violence also cause many of you and this superintendent to think of schools as a target. We recently presented a "State of the District" to our 800 school employees, and I committed to them a pledge of "Excellence by any measure" including the measure of safety of BH students and staff. I am comforted that we added a police force 10 years ago that is the best in the state, manned by professional men and women who treat the security of each of our children as a sacred trust. We have likewise dedicated \$10 million to safety-related initiatives in the last decade and recently added to our staff one of the state's first Safe School Coordinators.

These measures do not guarantee safety. What I can guarantee is we will lead the way in protecting our children and all of the adults who make it a life's calling to educate our children. My 10-year-old will not be soon whelping me again with a marshmallow. God willing, he will also never have to deal with school-place violence.

The BHISD School Board welcomed two new members in May. Barbers Hill graduate Chase Mitchell was appointed by the existing board to fill the vacancy left by retiring board member Benny May. Local businessman and long-time resident Eric

Davis was elected in May to fill position 6. Both men were sworn in during May meetings. Board members Becky Tice and Fred Skinner ran unopposed and were also sworn in for three-year terms in May. This was the first change in the BHISD Board of Trustees in nine years.

Building Excellence



Construction has been ongoing throughout the district in fulfillment of projects approved by voters in Bonds 2013 and 2017. Barbers Hill High School will open new classroom and computer lab space to accommodate 500 students this fall (Bond 2013). Both Middle School North and Middle School South will add classroom space for 250 students each this fall, in addition to a competition gym at MSN and a theater at MSS (Bond 2017).

Also approved in Bond 2017 was a new Early Childhood Center for grades Pre-K through First. Ground was broken this spring, and the new facility for our youngest Eagles is scheduled to open in fall, 2019. Plans are underway to renovate the existing Kindergarten Center and Primary School complex to an Administration building that includes a new, larger Board room, and space for all departments, which are currently housed in five satellite locations throughout the district.



VASE Art State Competition



Texas All-State Band


