Approval of Minutes

Minutes from January were reviewed and a motion was made by Colleen Goundrey to approval; 2nd by Ashley Shibley.

What's Happening in BHISD

Relay for Life is April 7th at Royal Raceway Park 5:30pm. Eagles V Cancer Basketball was 1/24 and had a good turnout. Strike-out Cancer was not a big turnout but they had inclement weather that day. However the Homerun Derby was a huge hit. Colleen wants to add a silent auction next year. Bay-Area is one of the top earners for the nation for Relay for Life. Hope asked about a tent for the school, and Colleen informed committee that due to time frame not being overnight anymore the school will not have a tent. Chelsea inquired about Jump, Hula, Twist program and it was mentioned that it may have already taken place. Susan mentioned Big Love Fund. It is not relay for life but it is a fundraiser that the high school student council is doing. Proceeds go to help families of patients with childhood cancer.

Aim for Success parent meeting is May 17th with the program being done for 6th and 7th grade on May 18th and 19th. Colleen is still concerned about turnout for parent meeting. Hope stated she would blast off Facebook page for her child's class when email went out from the school.

Community Health Fair Subcommittee

Chelsea spoke about the upcoming health fair. The subcommittee met before the SHAC meeting today (3/20). The date has been set for May 6th with a permit for the pavilion at the park secured. Everyone has their assignments and the subcommittee will be meeting again on 4/10/17 from 6-7.

Physical Activity and Fitness Planning Subcommittee

Subcommittee met in February and discussed campuses and playground safety issues. Colleen met with Jimmy Hook and he is willing to fix issues that we have found. There is no need to present to school board as they have budgeted for such needs. BHKC and Primary will not be getting new playground equipment because of the upcoming bond, but Jimmy agreed that they will fix the issues for the time being. Amy's campus had an injury to a child due to one of the pipes that was exposed. Maintenance has since filled the hole with concrete. The fire hydrant at the front of the Primary campus is proving to be an issue to secure due to the fact it must remain accessible. Colleen stated that we need to go back and check areas in April and follow up with Jimmy on any outstanding or new issues.

Open Discussion/Questions

Colleen spoke about the incident involving a track athlete that collapsed on the track during practice before spring break. She commended and applauded the coaches and trainers for their rapid response. The AED had to be used on the student and CPR. Student was transported to hospital and is now home and should be coming back to school soon. Colleen mentioned that there is two annual trainings for AED and CPR and that the district has roughly 25 AED around campuses. Hope asked if this was something that could have been prevented, and Colleen stated that it was not. However, this has brought to the forefront of checking to offer EKG or Echocardiograms to athletes at a reduced cost.
