

BHISD Trustees call Bond Election

arbers Hill ISD's Board of Trustees and district staff work hard on behalf of students and taxpayers, finding ways to stretch shrinking state dollars while developing new resources through partnerships with local industry.

In their August meeting, the BHISD School Board approved a bond election that would allow more of our tax dollars to remain at home. The \$60 million bond issue would bring no increase in taxes, because the district has utilized Value Limitations Agreements under Chapter 313 of the Tax Code that allow more tax money to remain in the district.

Unlike most bond issues, this proposal does not include new building construction. The average age of buildings in Barbers Hill ISD is 30 years, but our older campuses still have many years of good use ahead. If the bond is approved by voters, funds would be utilized to renovate existing campuses and to renew older mechanical systems such as piping and HVAC equipment. Other areas of focus would be to strengthen security for the protection of our students

and staff at each campus, and to upgrade classroom technology for enhanced instruction.

News You Can Use

STAAR BRIGHT



Barbers Hill students took the new state-mandated STAAR test in the spring this year. The state's rating system included two possible levels: "Met Standard" and "Improvement Required." Every campus in Barbers Hill ISD "Met Standard," and our district scored

above the state average in every category. In addition, Barbers Hill High School received Academic Achievement Distinction Designation for exceptional Student Progress. Barbers Hill Intermediate School received Achievement Distinctions in all three areas possible, including Math, Reading, and Student Progress.

As a result of recent state legislation, the number of End of Course exams required to graduate now includes five subjects: English 1, Algebra 1 and Biology, to be admin-

istered in 9th grade, as well as English 2 in 10th grade and U.S. History in 11th grade. Barbers Hill administrators and teachers spent many hours this summer building and refining curricula to assure state standards are within reach for every student in Barbers Hill.



CELL PHONE SAFETY



The 2013 Texas Legislature voted to further limit cell phone use inside school zones this year. In the past, cell phone use was prohibited while driving on the street during an active school zone. Beginning this year, that law is extended

to include any moving vehicle on school property during active school zone hours. This includes moving vehicles in car rider lines and parking lots. onstruction is well underway at Barbers Hill Elementary North, Barbers Hill Elementary South addition, and Barbers Hill Intermediate for conversion to a middle school.

When these campuses open in Fall 2014, BHISD will begin zoning students in grades 2-8. Students living south of Interstate 10 will attend BH Elementary South (current BH Elementary) in grades 2-5, and in grades 6-8 will attend BH Middle School South (current BH Intermediate).

Students in grades 2-5 living north of Interstate 10 will attend BH Elementary North (under construction) and in grades 6-8 will attend BH Middle School North (current Middle School).

Our Personnel Department is working diligently to make the transition seamless for faculty and staff. In December 2013, principals of each new campus will be announced, and in the spring, teachers will receive their campus assignments. Next summer will be busy with the physical move to new campuses and classrooms.

M.Q. Bradford Erustee 1970–1984

M.O. Bradford has been a member of the Barbers Hill community since his birth in 1923. A veteran of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, Mr. Bradford served in both the Europe and Pacific Theaters in World War 2. His wife, Alma Bradford, worked as a teacher for 42 years, serving the African American students of our district at the Old River Winfree School before integration. Mr. Bradford retired from Humble Oil/ExxonMobil after 35 years' service.

M.Q. Bradford provided leadership to Barbers Hill during a period of intense growth through service on the Board of Trustees from 1970-1984. During those 14 years, Barbers Hill voters passed bonds that allowed the construction of campuses we now know as the Kindergarten Center, Primary School, Intermediate School, Field House, Administration Building, and parts of the Middle School. Mr. Bradford's foresight and sacrificial service shaped our past, present, and continues to shape the future of Barbers Hill students and staff.

Barbers Hill Middle School became a



Shaping the future... there could not be a more appropriate theme that captures the economic environment of Mont Belvieu and Barbers Hill ISD. The BHISD Finance Department is helping to shape the future through several initiatives that will

The area economic momentum is evident by the industrial construction "on the hill" and the residential construction throughout the district. Drilling at the Eagle Ford Shale system continues at full throttle and Mont Belvieu is reaping the benefits. As a result, Barbers Hill ISD entered into Value Limitation Agreements with several area companies for the construction of new industrial facilities in our district. These new industrial facilities reflect significant capital investment in our area and will enhance the tax base of BHISD in the future. Further, these facilities will employ hundreds of construction workers and numerous full-time employees once they are fully operational, all of which contribute to the economic growth of our community. Industry is integral in the shaping and growth of our school district and greater community.

Barbers Hill is breaking new ground by going paperless in our Finance Department. BHISD is using an easy, space-efficient way to store student and personnel records while meeting local and state-mandated record requirements and reducing paper in the process.

Lastly, BHISD has again received the State's highest rating of "Superior Achievement" under T.E.A.'s financial accountability rating system ("FIRST"). BHISD has maintained a "Superior" rating since TEA established the rating system in 2002. Planning and Operations departments look forward to helping provide a safe, clean and stimulating environment for our students, faculty, staff and all stakeholders during the 2013-14 school year. After opening the new fine arts addition at the High School this past year, we are currently working on the 2014 opening of the South Elementary addition, the North Elementary addition, renovations at the

Intermediate School for its transition to a Middle School. and the extension of Perry Road to the North Elementary site. To the right you will find some of the activities our departments engaged in this past summer in preparing facility usage for another year of academic and extracurricular excellence on the Hill!









Operations

In the Operations Department our staff team-cleaned all buildings in addition to stripping and waxing all floors and cleaning behind the summer school staff and students. Our staff also refinished the gym floors at the Field House, Kindergarten Center, and High School.

Along with general duties of mowing and weed eating, the Grounds staff prepped all football fields as well as the cross country fields for the start of the new school year. All of the fields were aerated, fertilized, top-dressed with topsoil, and planted with Bermuda grass seed.

Transportation

In addition to keeping the buses rolling for summer school, the Transportation Department mechanics completed state inspections on all buses and service vehicles, checked and replaced brakes and tires as needed, and repaired or replaced seats in all our buses. Along with general maintenance, all bus surveillance cameras were inspected and repaired. Summer

school requirements for 191 students included 10 drivers and one aide for special needs routes. Our transportation staff have placed all bus routes on the school website under the Transportation page for parents to view as needed, thanks to our staff's diligence in learning the computerized Transfinder

Implementation of a comprehensive Energy Management plan in August of 2011 has been highly beneficial the past two years, culminating in energy savings of \$204,629 this past year and a savings of \$176,164 during the 2011-12 school year. This summer we retrofitted several areas with LED lights and recalibrated all thermostats to match our computer readings. Smart meters were also installed at

each building, which will enable us to measure real time current usage to avoid high peak demands. Additionally, we have set up an Energy Management information page on the school website under Planning and Operations where everyone can see our energy conservation progress. Interactive learning skills geared for adults and students are also

Maintenance

Our Maintenance Department upgraded plumbing fixtures in addition to moving furniture, hanging marker boards and projection screens. We also completed a number of painting projects throughout the district. The HVAC staff cleaned chillers and coils, as well as installed a new HVAC system in the DAEP, replaced bearings on the Intermediate gym units, and installed new condenser coils at the High School. The Primary School received a new compressor and a number of fan motors, blades and new ventilators were installed throughgut the district. Other HVAC work included improvements in the Ag meat prep room. Our electricians also replaced a number of floor outlets at the Kindergarten Center in addition to replacing bulbs and ballasts in every building.

Director of Technology



In 2004, when BHISD introduced the 1:1 laptop program, it became a model for other schools around the state and nation. Many school districts

came to Barbers Hill to see how our 1:1 program was implemented regarding

equipment, network configuration, and use in the classroom. A major need that was addressed at that time was that many homes in Barbers Hill did not have Internet access or computers. As technology has evolved since 2004, so has the access at home to technology devices and to the Internet.

From 2004 to 2013, we have seen a great deal of positive change that is moving us in a direction where our 1:1 program needs to take on a new look and feel. A recent survey of high school students done by our Tech department shows

that 84% of students have Internet access outside of school and that 99% of students have a personal technology device, with 90% of those having more than one!

Being new to this position since January, the baton has been recently passed to me. I want my part of this race to continue keeping us at the forefront of technol-



ogy. Although it is cliché to say that technology is ever-changing, it truly is. As the dynamics of technology devices and Internet access changes, we want to offer state-of-the-art technology to our students and teachers throughout the district.

A very popular term that is being used in the technology-savvy community is the "cloud." As I introduce Chromebooks at Barbers Hill High School this year, I look forward to using the Cloud for storage, apps and accessibility. With these devices, available in every classroom, students will learn while using devices they are fond of and which fit their lifestyle better. Having surveyed over 1200 BHISD students, I believe I have a much better understanding of their thoughts and feelings toward technology, and I look forward to keeping those lines of communication open and busy as the BHISD Technology Department moves us in a direction of continued

Another communication tool new this year will be teacher web pages through My Big Campus. Through the site's Parent Portal and mobile app, parents will be able to communicate with teachers, view assignments and events, and monitor their child's grades and progress.

Finally, a new program set to roll out this fall will provide parents and guardians the option to receive emergency alerts from Barbers Hill ISD via text message. These alerts will be reserved for emergency situations, such as a Shelter in Place status at a campus, or sudden changes to dismissal procedure due to severe weather. Participation in the program would require that you "opt in" once an initial message is sent. Stay tuned for more information about the program in coming weeks!
