

What parents need to know for the first day of school

and THE BELL

With ongoing road construction on Eagle Drive, Barbers Hill ISD will implement the following changes to start and dismissal times for the first two days of school. We appreciate your patience as Mont Belvieu officials work to meet the increasing traffic needs of our city.

All campuses will start and dismiss at regular times with the following exceptions on Monday and Tuesday, August 27th and 28th:

PreK - 6th grade buses will run one hour later than normal scheduled times. Car riders will still begin school at 8:20 a.m. Afternoon dis-

missal for all PreK - 6th grade students will be at the normal time of 3:40 p.m.

Middle and High School students will be dismissed at 2:35 p.m. on Monday and Tuesday only, to help facilitate Eagle Drive traffic flow.

Normal bell schedules will resume Wednesday, August 29:

Grades PreK - 6: 8:20 a.m. - 3:40 p.m.

Grades 7 - 12: 7:30 a.m. - 2:55 p.m.

Wynona Montgomery is a sixth-generation resident of Chambers County, a dedicated community volunteer, and an award-winning educator. Graduating as Valedictorian of the Barbers Hill Class of 1965, Wynona went on to become an Honors graduate of Lamar University and later earned her Master's degree from the University of Houston and 54+ hours of post-graduate coursework.

Wynona worked in Goose Creek CISD for 35 years (15 as a teacher, 20 as an administrator). During her years there she was named Teacher of the Year, Administrator of the Year, and she was selected to participate in the Fulbright Teacher Program in Japan.

Besides teaching, Wynona's great passions are learning and service. She continues to pursue both through travel and participation in many organizations, including the United Way of Baytown Area, West Chambers County Pilot Club, Women's Storybook Club, Relay for Life, and Baytown Symphony Orchestra. Wynona is a frequent guest at Barbers Hill, where she volunteers with Pilot and Anchor Club activities for students.

Elizabeth Gill is a dedicated 30-year Barbers Hill educator and a True Blue Eagle. Her most famous legacies at Barbers Hill, besides the hundreds of students she guided, are the motto, "We Can, We Will, We're Barbers Hill!" which she created, and her memoir, From County Line to Barbers Hill, which she authored in 2006. The collection of essays recounts much of Barbers Hill ISD history from 1949, when she and her husband became teachers on the Hill.

Mrs. Gill graduated as Valedictorian of the Mount Pleasant High School Class of 1945 and with Honors from East Texas Baptist College. She earned her Master's degree from the University of Houston, and 30+ hours of post-graduate work. She has served in numerous leadership positions for Chambers County Educational Association, Texas State Teachers Association, Daughters of the American Revolution and First Baptist Church Mont Belvieu.

Mrs. Gill continues to serve the Barbers Hill community through the BHISD Mentor Program and through frequent columns she writes for *The Baytown Sun* and *Hometown Journey Magazine*.

It is an honor, a joy, and a responsibility to be part of a district with a strong history and tradition of excellence. Our quest for excellence is evident in everything we

do, including academics. Heroic effort has been expended to prepare for the many changes facing our schools. Some of the initiatives and activities that will prepare our students for college and beyond include:

 Over 100 teachers have worked this summer to revamp district curricula to ensure student success.



Instructional Technologists Alicia Brooks and Suzie Wilburn provided hours of professional development opportunities this summer, allowing teachers to learn about new and developing technology applications for

- Teachers have participated in assessment training and are developing tests that gauge student performance against curricula expectations. These assessments will be used as tools to monitor student performance, identify remediation needs, and to expose our students to the same level and rigor of questioning required on STAAR and EOC assessments.
- A district-wide plan to cultivate academic vocabulary will be implemented this year at every grade level.

- Teachers, administrators, and para-professionals have logged a record number of hours in professional development to ensure we are using the most effective and efficient teaching tools and techniques to foster academic growth and achievement.
- A STEM program will be launched this year in BHISD and will be piloted at the Middle School as an elective course. This program provides "hands-on" activities that integrate Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics. Students will be designing, engineering, and constructing innovative projects with "real world" applications bringing classroom instruction to life.
- We are working with local industry to develop a pathway for BHISD students to take courses that will prepare them for the hundreds of jobs we anticipate in the next five years due to expansion initiatives in local industry.

It is a great time to be an Eagle and we encourage you to be actively involved in this outstanding district. Kindergarten through Middle School campuses will host an Eagle Launch prior to the first day of school in order to familiarize students and parents with the campus. The High School will have a Freshman Orientation to facilitate successful transition for 9th-graders. Later in the fall, each school will host an Open House where parents can see first-hand the great things going on in classrooms. I encourage you to attend each of these important events with your students.

In addition, there are volunteer programs and mentor programs whereby community members can share their time and expertise to support the great things going on throughout the district. Get involved! Assistant Superintendent of Technology

One of the challenges currently facing all school districts is how to advance needed technology programs in the midst of economic chal-

lenges across the state and country. Here at Barbers Hill we have been very fortunate to have the support of the School Board and community in developing state of the art programs that support student learning. As an example, for many years, we have had the 1-1 laptop program.

One of the next evolutions that I see on the horizon is what is being termed by many as "Bring Your Own Technology." Much of the needed technology to allow students to have access to Internet resources and learning materials (many in the form of apps) are now in their hands. BYOT provides an avenue for students to use these devices that they already own in a safe and secure way. In essence, a private

internal network is created that protects the host agency and at the same time allows the student the full benefit of using their own device here at school.

In the long run this could save districts both time and money. And, it could allow districts to shift needed

resources to internal infrastructures and additional instructional materials to help students learn even more effectively. Look for the implementation of such an approach on the horizon for many, including Barbers Hill ISD.

Assistant Superintendent of Finance

With the continuing expansion of the Eagle Ford Shale system, Mont Belvieu represents the centerpiece of the natural gas liquids network and

is the premier North American delivery point for liquids production according to industry experts. As a result of this growth, Barbers Hill ISD entered into Value Limitation Agreements with four area companies in 2011-12 for the construction of new fractionator units in our district. These facilities, operated by Enterprise Products, Lone Star Fractionators, Oneok, and Cedar Bayou Fractionators, will employ hundreds of construction workers and numerous full-time employees once they are fully operational, all of which contribute to the economic growth of our community.

This summer, the School Board approved two additional Property Value Limitation Applications with Enterprise Products for the construction of two new fractionator units at their Mont Belvieu industrial site with a combined investment of \$580 million. These new units will further enhance the tax base of BHISD, and reflect continued capital investment in our area. Other companies have contacted the district with intentions to expand their facilities as well and are expected to request limitation agreements from BHISD in 2012. These truly are exciting times on the Hill!

BHISD has again received the state's highest rating of "Superior Achievement" under T.E.A.'s financial accountability rating system ("FIRST"). BHISD has maintained a "Superior" rating since TEA established the rating system in 2002.

Assistant Superintendent of Planning and **Operations**

Facility improvements and Maintenance, Operations and Transportation departmental activities have been numerous this summer

in preparing excellent learning environments for our students. In order to accommodate enrollment growth, capital projects this summer included High School Fine Arts expansion and renovations, Intermediate School Fine Arts renovations, and a front entry security vestibule.

Operations Department staff members attended a seminar in Conroe in preparation of piloting a new micro-fiber cleaning program at the High School.

The district locksmith pinned approximately 78 new locks and repaired or replaced several existing locks for areas within the district. The summer floor crew has been stripping and waxing all district floors along with refinishing three district gym floors. Summer cleaning crews provided custodial services for all summer staff, summer school, as well as deep cleaning on all campuses.

Transportation Department mechanics replaced a number of brakes shoes, drums, and fuel pumps as well as changed oil and repaired seats, and checked and replaced tires. Along with general maintenance, all bus surveillance cameras have been inspected and repaired. For summer school, 155 students were transported with 8 bus routes. Routes are being updated for the 2012-13 school year and will be posted on the school website on the Transportation page in August.

Along with their general duties of mowing and weed eating, the Grounds staff repaired the playground at the Primary School, cleaned the walkways in front of the Primary and Kindergarten Center, and put up a bird barrier along the top of the Intermediate School outdoor commons gates.

The Maintenance Department completed numerous painting projects, repaired water leaks and leaky faucets, as well as hanging marker boards and projection screens throughout the district. The HVAC technicians have been cleaning chillers and coils at all campuses in addition to working on pump motors and other equipment to insure top performance. Our electricians replaced numerous ballasts and lamps district wide in preparation for the new school year.

The departments of Planning and Operations look forward to another banner year at BHISD in providing outstanding learning environments to our students, faculty and all stakeholders.

Barbers Hill students will not only go for the gold in campus cafeterias this year, but for the red, green, and orange as well, in the form of fruits

and vegetables.

On January 25, 2012, First Lady Michelle Obama announced new school meal nutrition standards that go into effect this year. One of the biggest changes is that students in grades K-6 will be required to take one fruit or vegetable serving in every tray lunch. Under the new federal standards, school meals must:

- Offer larger servings of vegetables and fruit, and children must take at least one serving.
- Offer a wide variety of vegetables, including at least a weekly serving of

dark green and red/orange vegetables and legumes.

- Not exceed 10 percent of calories from saturated fat, and have no transfat
- Follow strict calorie limits.
- Provide only fat-free or 1% milk.
- Gradually reduce sodium levels.
- Gradually include more whole-grain rich foods.

Meal prices will remain the same for the 2012-13 school year. Parents may pay for school lunches by sending a check with their student, payable to Barbers Hill Cafeteria, or by paying online. The online payment option includes a \$1 convenience fee for each transaction. Parents may monitor their child's balance and daily purchases, as well as make payments, by logging into Family Access on bhisd.net.
